I hope that summer has gone well for all. While our economy is in a slowdown mode, we at Interfaith Neighbors are heading well into the opposite direction. Each division is running on all cylinders and full speed ahead. God has blessed us with an incredible staff. They know that the harder they work, the more people are getting the assistance they need.

Our rental and mortgage assistance program is working non-stop. The phones are ringing off the wall and some people just come in to our office from all parts of Monmouth County.

Meals on Wheels has been inundated with requests. We found it necessary to put a freeze on new meal recipients as we were running way over our budget. Fortunately, an unexpected funding source was sent directly from heaven (I have always maintained that the Higher Power is looking out for us), and the freeze was immediately lifted.

Our affordable housing division completed and sold three new houses and immediately started three more. The Springwood Center was also completed and has become our flagship project. Tenants are moving in, the Asbury Park Senior Center is in full swing and ground floor occupancy is filling up.

Congratulations to our new homeowners at 1501 and 1503 Stratford Ave (pictures inside). Interfaith Neighbors has now completed 45 units of affordable housing. These include for-sale single-family detached homes and for-rent units in the new Springwood Center.

Interfaith Neighbors launched its affordable housing program in 1996 with help from an initial investment from New Jersey Natural Gas. Since the inception of this program, Interfaith Neighbors has built 45 total units of high quality, affordable housing. Over \$5 million has been invested in the construction of our "for sale" affordable housing units, with an additional investment of over \$1.5 million in eight affordable rental units. In the next 3-5 years, IFN is planning to produce some 30-35 additional units of housing for low-income families.
