Youth Corps Crew Leaders Stand Tall

Kemi Sancho, 18, studied at so many schools on his life path from Lafayette, Indiana, to Newark to Somerville and finally Neptune his senior year, that he dropped out of Neptune Township High School last December because he faced still another year and a half to get the graduation credits he needed.

Instead, this past January, Sancho began the 12-week New Jersey Youth Corps of Monmouth County program at Interfaith Neighbors. In early May, he passed his General Education Development test (GED), gaining his high school equivalency credential.

"I felt like this is going to be the start of a new beginning and I need to go to college now," Sancho said. "I just did what I needed to do to get the education I need."

Sancho's set to go to Brookdale Community College in September where he plans to study the culinary arts. He was chosen to be a paid Youth Corps crew leader after completing his program and is considered a strong role model for new participants.

Youth Corps director Meg Flores estimates that perhaps 450 young people have come through the program since Interfaith took it over as the sponsoring agency from the Asbury Park Board of Education in 2006. The program offers GED instruction, work experience through community service and life skills training.

Freedom Jackson, 22, of Neptune, has been the program's second crew leader this summer while getting tutored to pass his GED test. He finished up the 12-week program June 21 and is continuing to study. He will not give up.

Jackson had to leave Asbury Park High School in November of his senior year in 2007 because he was living at his grandmother's house in Neptune.

Neptune Township school officials would not allow him to finish up at Neptune Township High School because he was not listed on his grandmother's rental lease.

The active senior did not have an official home to call his own and became a dropout. He decided he'd try to be successful without finishing high school.

"Every job application I ever filled out asked did you finish high school?" Jackson said. "I have to get my GED. I won't feel complete without it."

The program runs from 8:45 a.m. until 3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. The next session open to dropouts aged 16 to 25 will begin in early October. Participants have to provide a birth certificate and a social security card. A monetary stipend is provided. Flores said the program is required to follow up on participants for several months, but in Interfaith's

case, that commitment is open ended.
"Our doors are always open to our youth," she said. "We will always be here to help."
