Focus on Meals on Wheels: Volunteer Kathy Fitzpatrick



Kathy Fitzpatrick has volunteered for Meals on Wheels delivery for the past 20 years. She has had several occasions when her arrival to deliver a meal became a rescue mission—or perhaps a mission of mercy!

About 3 to 4 months ago, she found an elderly female recipient on the floor. This lady knew Kathy, and yet seemed confused and disoriented, did not recognize her and did not know why she was in her home. Suspecting that the woman had experienced a stroke, Kathy called 911 and waited until the rescue squad arrived to take her to the hospital.

About a year ago, on a Monday morning, Kathy arrived at the home of a recipient in Avon, who received meals Monday through Friday. She found the lady on the floor, where she had fallen shortly after accepting her Friday meal. She had not had any food or water all weekend, and had been unable to move to get help. Kathy did not move

her, but did call 911. The lady was transported to a local hospital and then to a rehabilitation facility where she remained for several months. She has since returned home to her apartment, continues to receive meals on wheels, and her apartment manager checks on her regularly.

Many years ago, about the time she first started delivering meals, Kathy found a Belmar meal recipient on the floor of her apartment in a senior building. She had fallen during the early morning hours and could not move to get help for herself. She needed help getting up, and Kathy was able to assist her.

Another meal recipient whom Kathy knew had, over the years, moved to various locations, and Kathy had made a point of keeping in touch, delivering meals, and visiting with this lady on a regular basis. When this lady celebrated her 100th birthday, Kathy was there. She was given a book of poems which this lady had written—and she still has that special book. The lady has since passed away, but Kathy remembers her with fondness.

Interfaith Neighbors Introduces New Business Development Center

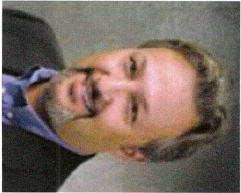
Interfaith Neighbors has announced the addition of their sixth major program: *The Interfaith Neighbors Business Development Center*. This is a multi-year initiative designed to promote economic development, expand business opportunity and create jobs on the West Side of Asbury Park and surrounding area.

Initially, Interfaith Neighbors will provide business acceleration and mentoring to prospective entrepreneurs. New businesses need the mentoring of experienced business people to increase the probability of success. New business owners often face challenges such as lack of access to business education and skill development, and inadequate access to capital. To help new businesses overcome these challenges, we will engage in active business mentoring and training.

As a part of this new program, Interfaith Neighbors is working to develop a Business and Career Academy and Business Advisory Board (see information to the right for course details). Plans are also in place to develop a Business Incubator as part of the Springwood Center real estate development project. The IFN *Asbury Business Incubator*, which will be the only one of its kind operating in this area, will open in September 2012, and will provide new entrepreneurs with physical space and resources to help launch their businesses.

Kerri Martin of *Second Life Bikes* was the first entrepreneur to begin working with the Business Development Center. Kerri explains: “Their expertise has been invaluable, allowing me to focus on my mission at Second Life Bikes.” With the assistance of the Business Development Center, Kerri has found new space to operate her business, and hired her first employee.

Roger Boyce, Interfaith Neighbors Business Development Director stresses the importance of this program, “We must create a helpful environment for entrepreneurs enabling them to create new firms resulting in new jobs.”



Roger Boyce, Director IFN Business Development Center explains the potential long-term impact of this program,

saying “We are prepared to mentor dozens of entrepreneur hopefuls and turn their dreams into successful small businesses. Our goal is to help those dreams of today become tomorrow’s reality.”

Business and Career Academy: New Upcoming Courses!!

A successful entrepreneur requires specific business knowledge and skills. To help the local community acquire this knowledge, Interfaith Neighbors of Asbury Park with Monmouth and Ocean Small Business Development Center/OBDC are collaborating to sponsor a series of workshops for current and aspiring entrepreneurs.

Workshops and Fees

Start-Up Business Workshop: Examine the legal forms of ownership, how to register a business, setting up bookkeeping records, taxation, and understanding financial statements, money needs, payroll, insurance and licensing. The course fee is \$55. Code: XBUSD 001F

A Business Plan: Even the most skeptical banker can be persuaded positively with a convincing business plan. Learn how your finished plan should

look, what’s to be included, which language to use, and what information to present and in what format so your plans are clearly convincing. The course fee is \$40. Code: XBUSD 008 F

Financing Small Business: Interested in starting a business or expanding an existing business? Need financial assistance? This workshop will address these issues by providing information on determining money needs, SBA loans, venture capital, working with local banks, use of a business plan to secure financing, services provided by the Small Business Development Center.
